Barking Up the Wrong Tree

What are we to do if our dog has a barking spate while we are gone? We all live in a close-knit **and** close by neighborhood. Patt Baenen has had excellent luck with this type. Another option is a smell collar, Premier Pet Gentle Spray, from Pet Safe on Middlefield Rd. in Palo Alto at 650-856-6666. If everyone joins in the effort to create a quiet and calm neighborhood, then our dogs will have the same benefit as us. Remember to keep the collar on each time you are gone.
