Rain, Rain Go Away

NO-O-O-O! We need the rain, but there are things we need to take care of before the rain befalls us.

1. Clean off your **roof** so those leaves do not flow into your gutters during a heavy rain.
2. Clean out your **gutters**, and do not forget to flush those **downspouts**. We had lots of oak moth worm castings this year and this can easily clog the gutters and cause overflow.
3. Check that the **exits** to the downspouts are directed away from the foundation of your house and not onto your neighbor's property.
4. Make sure you clean the **drains** under your driveway entrances. These are not considered the jurisdiction of the San Mateo County crews that come around to clean up.
5. If you have **dead trees** on your property that may come down in the winter wind and rains, and will impact buildings or roads, consider taking care of those before the rains hit.
6. Replace those worn **windshield wipers**, before the windshield becomes one smeary mess.

Do not forget we are in a drought crisis. Whatever rain we get this winter will not terminate the drought. Water saving is still crucial for us to get by again next summer.

Los Trancos County Water District News

On September 30, 2015, the Los Trancos County Water District was officially dissolved. The District's former functions have been transferred to various other entities in the County of San Mateo, including the Woodside Fire Protection District and the San Mateo County Department of Public Works. The County has formed a County Maintenance District to oversee the services formerly provided by the Water District. The former Board Members of the Water District will serve on the community advisory committee of the Maintenance District on an interim basis.

The lands formerly owned by the Water District are now subject to conservation easements held by the MidPeninsula Regional Open Space District.
