It is that time of the year again when leaves fall and our road swales and driveway culverts get clogged with debris. The county's normal maintenance schedule of swales and stormwater culverts is once during the fall-winter season; however, expect Department of Public Works (DPW) staff to be out there if there is a flooding situation. We should all be concerned about the overflow of water on the roads and into your or your neighbor's properties. Please be preemptive - take the first step and clean up those swales and culverts. Most pipes running under driveways belong to homeowners and thus are not serviced by DPW, so it is especially important to keep these clear of debris. Repeat cleanings will no doubt also be necessary. If you are unable, please reach out to a neighbor or us for help. Thank you!
