This priceless gift for the whole family takes about 30 min. to put together at any time that is convenient for you. We have even made the list for you:

- 1. Day pack or small duffel

- 3. Extra set of clothes, including for rain, cold, hat, work gloves, bandana, and old sturdy shoes
- 4. Water and food (high energy snack bars are always good)
- 5. Flashlight
- 6. Copy of important papers in Ziploc bag, e.g., driver's license, bank cards and accounts

### Community Advisory Committee (CAC)

<u>Fire Safety Program:</u> Woodside Fire Protection District (WFPD) reports that roughly 10 households have taken advantage of the program through mid-October resulting in incentive reimbursements of over \$37,000. This is a great program that keeps our whole community safer with incentives for home hardening (fire safe vents, roofs, exteriors, double paned windows & skylights, etc.) and defensible space. Qualifying projects by individual homeowners are eligible for 50% rebates of the project costs, up to a maximum \$5,000 rebate.

We need your help! Please participate in a study to identify POTENTIALLY hazardous trees that are OVERHANGING POWER LINES by reporting any that are NEAR or ON your property. Send to Denise Enea, WFPD Fire Marshall, <u>denea@woodsidefire.org</u>. We will keep you posted with findings.

<u>Stormwater Management Program</u>: The San Mateo County Department of Public Works (DPW) reports that the Carmel Way drainage project remains in the decision-making phase. Ramona/Los Trancos Circle projects have been permitted and approved; work will proceed as soon as an alternate sub-contractor is identified after the first one became unavailable.

As a reminder, the CAC serves as a communications conduit between the community and DPW and WFPD to help determine the best use of the property tax revenue that used to be allocated to the now dissolved water district.
