<u>Los Trancos County Maintenance District -</u> <u>Community Advisory Committee (CAC)</u>

Mark your calendars for our first live meeting since Covid 2020 on October 3, 2023 at 7:00 pm at 40 Ciervos Road! Bring your ideas, questions and concerns on the fire safety program, stormwater control enhancements, and Lake Road area lands management. Don Bullard with Woodside Fire Protection District (WFPD) will be coming to answer questions on the new defensible space and incentive program, and more.

In other news, the CAC met twice recently with the Department of Public Works (DPW). They will soon take the first steps on a **Stormwater Project**, creating a scope of work so that engineering and construction estimates can be secured and feasibility determined.

The **Fire Safety Program** is in full swing and quarterly incentive payments are running smoothly. To qualify for the Maintenance District incentive program, which offers 50% reimbursement for approved work, up to \$5,000 annually per household, you must have your property inspected. The **Woodside Fire Chipper Program** is well-used! Los Trancos Woods and Vista Verde have 3 chipper days annually. The first two are funded entirely by Woodside Fire, while the third **chipper day** (October 23rd this year) is funded by our Maintenance District. Reminder that piles should be put curbside no more than 2 weeks prior. Going forward, we hope all will follow the guidelines.

A thank you to our wonderful community for having helped Jimmy feel at home, create friendships, and learn life and works skills these past 18 years. He was 5 years old when we moved here, and he is now 23! Jimmy will be off to college on August 1 for an amazing next stage of his life.

Jimmy will be attending the Fresno State University Wayfinders program. It is a 2 year program, where he will be living just off campus in apartments with over 800 fellow Fresno State general education students, as well as 20 students in his program. This program for adults with intellectual disabilities will teach him independent living skills such as shopping, cooking, cleaning, budgeting, paying bills, and managing his apartment. He also will have the opportunity to take or audit classes at Fresno State, and will be doing work internships and volunteer work. He wants to continue working with animals and doing fire prevention there. The goal for the program is that when he graduates, he will be ready to work and live independently!

Jimmy says "see you when I get back". He also wanted to add that he won't be around to pick up the poo bags left on the trails, so he says "please pick up the poo bags. Please don't litter!" He has always been good at cleaning up around the neighborhood-now cleaning up around his own house is another matter they will have to address in his college program !
